The protagonist, Elliot, symbolizes the unknown, while the human boy Cheng Hao represents the pursuit of truth and understanding. Their relationship creates a layer of subtle ambiguity that adds depth to the story. Cheng Hao, a carefree and unrestrained young man, contrasts sharply with his younger brother Cheng Rui, who is more cautious and adheres strictly to the rules. Despite their differences, there is an underlying,

unspoken care between them, portrayed through their emotional journey. As the two siblings gaze toward one another across the vast expanse of the stars, they question the nature of the unknown: Is it truly as dangerous as it seems? Can distant, unreachable places ever truly be reached? Their exploration, full of youthful bravery and tenderness, is both sweet and slightly bitter, and through the author's brilliant use of light, shadows, and intricate linework, readers are left eagerly anticipating the unfolding of the story's next chapter.
